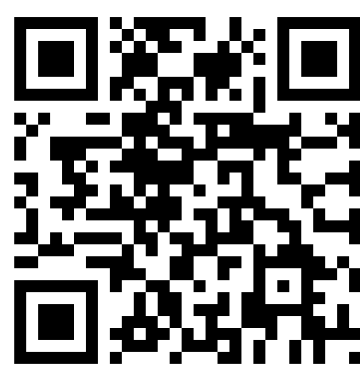
What is Crown?

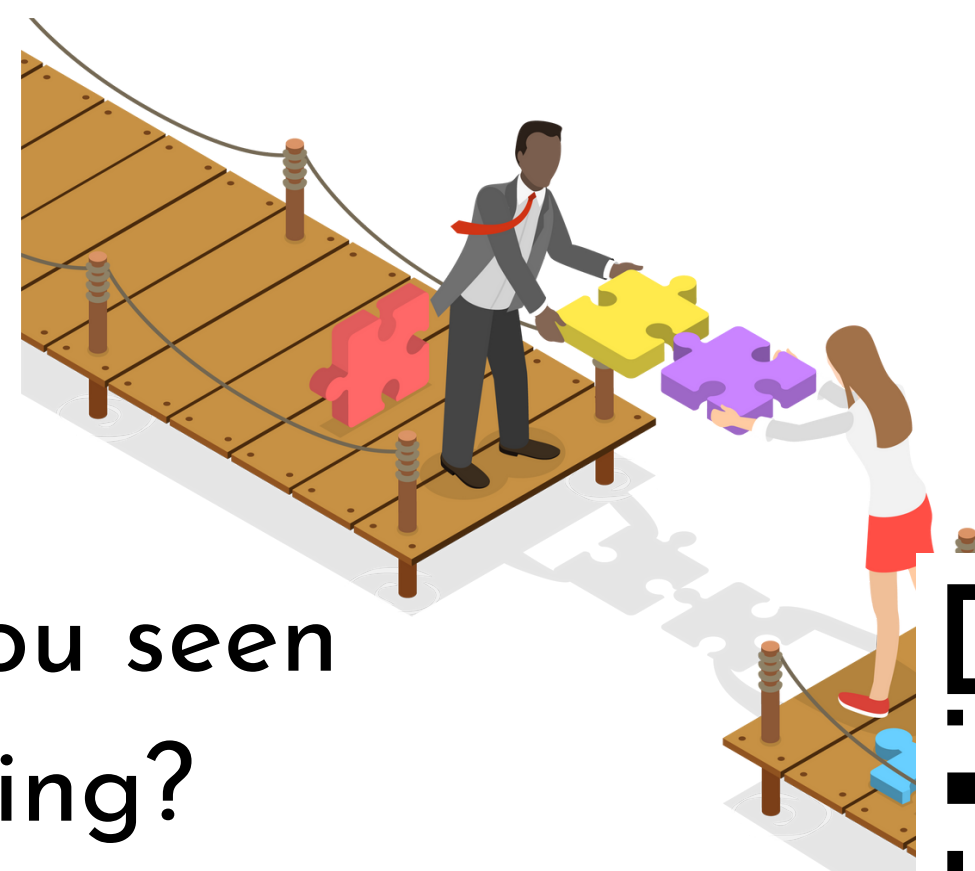
