

# Pinedale, WY: July 7 - 10, 2008

Pinedale, Wyoming, is at the center of the storm surrounding fossil fuel development and its impact on wildlife. The area has the nation's second largest natural gas field, but also provides over 200,000 acres of sage grouse habitat and part of the longest migration corridor for mule deer and pronghorn. Additionally, due largely to gas rig emissions, Pinedale and surrounding areas have ozone levels similar to those of a large city.

During their stay in Pinedale, researchers visited with representatives of Shell, Questar, Encana, the Pinedale BLM office, the Teddy Roosevelt Conservation Partnership, the Wyoming Fish and Game, and the Upper Green River Valley Coalition.
