## **The Leadership Institute's Broadcast Journalism School A Two-day Seminar in Washington DC**

I would like to attend the Leadership Institute Broadcast Journalism School on November 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>. As a journalism minor and the news editor for the Catalyst, I have spent a lot of time studying and practicing journalism. I would like to pursue a career in journalism after I graduate. I am hoping that this program will give me an insight into the journalism field and that it will be a stepping stone to an eventual career in journalism.

The two-day program is intended "to give aspiring journalists the skills necessary to bring balance to the media and to succeed in this highly competitive field." My time in D.C. will be filled with workshops like "Media Ethics" and "Is a News Career Right for You?" As an alumni of this school, I will be given the opportunity to do a paid journalism internship in the D.C. area. As I am planning to spend next semester interning in Washington D.C., this two-day school will give me an edge when applying to those highly competitive internship programs.

Once I return to campus I intend to give an afternoon seminar about what I learned. The seminar would be part of a series of seminars the Catalyst editors are offering this year. It will be advertised through the student listserv and to all people involved with campus publications. I also plan to report back to the Dean's Advisory Committee with an evaluation of my time in D.C.
