These changes will have no impact on those who have already declared. If you declare this year, beginning with those declaring in Block 1, know that your schedule must reflect the following in order to satisfy the requirements of the major.

#### **Required Courses (5 credits)**

- □ SO228 Development of Sociological Thought
- □ SO229 Research Design
- □ SO301/2 Quantitative or Qualitative Methods
- $\Box$  SO450 Senior Thesis/Capstone (2 credits)

#### **Electives (6 credits)**

 $\Box$  No more than three 100-level electives may count toward the major

- $\Box$  At least one 300-level elective (prior to SO450)
- $\Box$  SO451 Senior Seminar cannot count as an elective  $\Box$  Study abroad programs that include a sociological element <u>may</u> contribute 1 elective unit to the major
