Lydia Ballantine '17 (Not Pictured) won the first place prize for the 2017 Alpha Kappa Delta Undergraduate Paper Competition with her Senior Thesis titled, "LGBTQ Youth Homelessness: an Examination of Upstream Factors." First place winners are awarded a cash prize and an all expense paid trip to the American Sociological Society Annual Meeting in Philadelphia, PA. Lydia's paper used a mixed-methods approach to determine the predictors of the percentage of homeless LGBTQ youth in the US. Results showed that low education level was associated with higher percentages of homeless LGBTQ youth on a county level and that the level of community acceptance of LGBTQ people was associated with reported population size of homeless LGBTQ youth.
