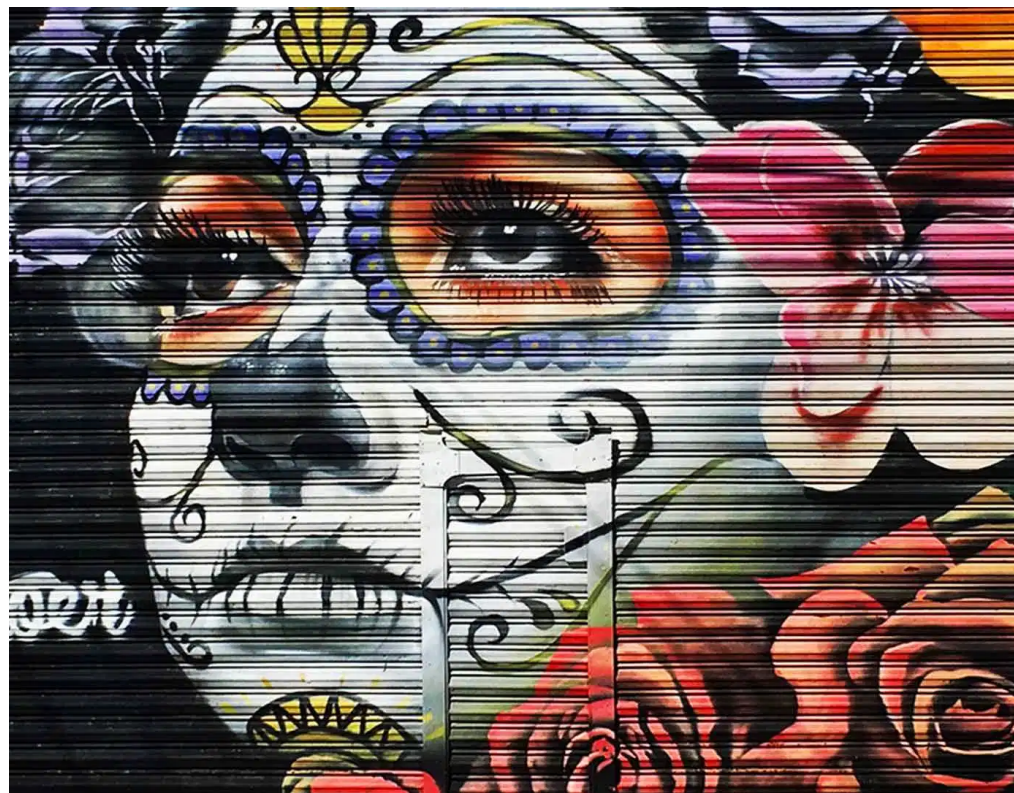

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The CC in Latin America program offers students a unique multidisciplinary experience abroad. It provides academic immersion into two Latin American cultures – in their similarities and differences – on the block plan, with CC faculty from different academic disciplines. All courses will also be taught in Spanish! Students will also have the opportunity to live with host families where meals will be provided!

Prerequisites: SP201 or placement into SP305.

Possible program-sponsored trips: the Tigre Delta, gaucho estancia San Antonio de Areco, Colonia de Sacramento (in Argentina); Chichén Itza, Uxmal, Valladolid, and Celestún biosphere reserve (in México).

SEMESTER PROGRAM

Participation for the whole semester is encouraged as students will be able to fully immerse themselves in a new environment by visiting important landmarks, speaking the Spanish language and enveloping themselves into two different Latin American cultures.

BENEFITS OF GOING ABROAD ON THE BLOCK PLAN!

There are many benefits of going abroad with CC on the block plan! Some examples are developing and keeping deep relationships with CC professors, maintaining your block plan endurance and **all** coursework is through CC so there will be no transfer concerns, and you will make long-lasting friendships. **Please note that students will have to participate for a minimum of 2 blocks! Single blocks abroad are not offered for this program.**

TUITION & FEES

Students who have chosen to participate in the full semester program will pay the standard Colorado College tuition, full meal plan and housing for the semester as if they were living on campus. Funds from all three are used to cover the costs of the program in Latin America.

Students opting for the two block option also pay full semester tuition, room, and board if they will be living on campus for the remaining 2 blocks of the semester. Students traveling with the program for Blocks 3&4 will not be required to move out of their Block 1&2 housing and will return to the same housing placement.

Students who will be living off campus and/or have a limited or no meal plan will be billed a program fee equivalent to the funds which the Latin America program receives from housing and meal plan funds. Students are responsible for coverage of any off-campus housing costs during the time they will be traveling.

Airfare: An airfare stipend that will vary between the 4 block vs. 2 block program will be provided to each student up to the standard airfare limit.

Additional costs: Personal expenses and books are expected to cost approximately \$950.

APPLICATION DEADLINE AND PROCESS

The application is available now on SUMMIT. Applications will be considered on a rolling basis until **April 1st, 2021**. After you submit your application you will be contacted to set up an interview.
