Tuition & Fees

Students who have chosen to participate in the full semester program will pay the standard Colorado College tuition, full meal plan and housing for the semester as if they were living on campus. Funds from all three are used to cover the costs of the program in latin America

Students opting for the two block option also pay full semester tuition, room, and board if they will be living on campus for the remaining 2 blocks of the semester. Students traveling with the program for Blocks 3&4 will not be required to move out of their Block 1&2 housing and will return to the same housing placement.

Students who will be living off campus and/or have a limited or no meal plan will be billed a program fee equivalent to the funds which the Latin America program receives from housing and meal plan funds. Students are responsible for coverage of any off-campus housing costs during the time they will be traveling.

Airfare: An airfare stipend that will vary between the 4 block vs. 2 block program will be provided to each student up to the standard airfare limit.

Additional costs: Personal expenses and books are expected to cost approximately \$950.
