BOOK PROJECT

Professionalizing Asian America: Race & Labor in the Twenty-First Century argues that Asian Americans' entrance into increasingly diverse professions enculturates new narratives of race, generationality, and solidarity. Historically conceived as yellow peril invaders and model minorities who threaten American individualism and modernity, Asian Americans redefine such ideologies through their access to newer modes of work in the global economy. My project situates professionalization conceptually to reveal how the institutional structures that manage workplace socialization operate dynamically as evolving ideological cultural formations that regulate minorities even as they become represented within contemporary workspaces. I read fiction by Gish Jen, Julia Cho, Charles Yu, and Dave Eggers, among others, alongside cookbooks by celebrity chefs, Silicon Valley business archives, industry exposés, video blogs on YouTube and TikTok, and techno-Orientalist science fiction to analyze how workplace conditions impact cultural narratives about race. My project offers a critical framework for realizing the institutional, ideological, and cultural logics that regulate twenty-first-century Asian Americans; identifies emergent racial formations amid shifting modes of work; and accounts for generational differences and interracial solidarities through professionalism.
