Current Research

I am currently working on two research projects. First, I am developing a realist approach to metaphysics that avoids inflexibility. The case I use to illustrate this is my “model” of gender, meant to replace the common, but unhelpful models that dominate public and academic discourses about gender. Briefly, I think that words like ‘man’ and ‘woman’ are highly indeterminate and purpose-dependent, so that no single (or simple) conceptual analysis can get them right. If we treat the metaphysics of gender as “modeling,” we can capture its pragmatic aspect. And so for metaphysics more broadly. Second, I am thinking about fictional representations of artificial intelligence, and what they reveal about our attitudes toward consciousness and intelligence.
