


A hub for academic support services, the library is a dynamic place where the CC community comes together to share ideas, explore, and create knowledge.

GARDEN LEVEL

A place to explore library collections and for quiet concentration



- The **Julie Penrose Reading Room** is a grand space for quiet study and special events. About 2,000 books by Colorado College faculty, staff, and alumni are displayed below the windows.
- **Special Collections** houses a heavily used teaching collection of rare books and manuscripts along with the college archives. It has a state-of-the-art temperature- and humidity-controlled storage vault, a research room seating 12, and an instruction space for class visits.
- Most of the circulating **Book Collection** is housed here on compact shelving.
- Study spaces include study pods, group study rooms, and carrels, including the Quon Corner Study Carrels that fourth-year students can reserve by the block.

FIRST FLOOR

A hub for innovative technology



- **Circulation Desk** circulates books, DVDs, class reserves, laptops and other technology.
- **ITS: Solutions Center** provides assistance to the campus community in protecting, maintaining, and operating computers.
- The **Helen and Arthur E. Johnson GIS Lab** supports spatial analysis, integrating geographic information, spatial reasoning, and data visualization into classes and research.
- Class of 1967 Tech Sandbox supports cutting-edge technological innovation in the classroom and beyond.
- **Ryan Data Viz Lab** enables innovative teaching, research, events, and performances through immersive visualization.
- **Experimental Classroom** can be a high-tech classroom, lab, and event space.
- Welcome Desk in the R. Thayer Tutt Entryway helps you get oriented and find resources.

SECOND FLOOR


A hub for academic support and student success



- **Research Services** helps students find, access, and evaluate sources and provides expert assistance with all aspects of the research process.
- The **Colket Center for Academic Excellence**, including the Writing Center, Quantitative Reasoning Center, Thesis and ESL support, cultivates students' academic skills through collaborative learning, peer teaching, and intellectual community.
- The **Advising Hub** helps students explore their interests and goals, choose course schedules, monitor academic progress, and secure national and international fellowships.
- The **Crown Faculty Center** encourages imaginative, dedicated, self-reflective teaching and promotes and supports faculty scholarship, research, and writing.
- The **Event Space** can be opened to include the hallway and the **"Open"** outdoor terrace, and **The 1991 Classroom** in room 238 is used for teaching and student-focused events.

THIRD FLOOR


Collaboration, conversation, and a café



- **Susie B's** serves coffee to as many as 700 students per day and is a popular place for faculty to hold office hours.
- The third-floor **"Open"** outdoor terrace beyond the café features succulent plants and photovoltaic solar panels that contribute to our net-zero carbon footprint.
- The **Art Book Collection** is shelved alongside an exhibit of kiln-fired books by CC artist Scott Johnson.
- A variety of **study spaces**, **instructional labs**, **and classrooms** provide places to learn and collaborate.

FOURTH FLOOR


Expansive views foster a sense of place
