MEDIA ADVISORY: Colorado College to Host 149th Commencement Ceremony Sunday, May 28

Former U.S. Representative and CC alumna Liz Cheney to deliver keynote address

WHAT: 149th Commencement Ceremony for Colorado College. The college will confer academic degrees on approximately 540 graduates in the Class of 2023. The ceremony will be followed by a reception outside on the Tava Quad from 11 a.m.-1 p.m.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER: Former U.S. Representative and CC graduate Liz Cheney '88 will deliver the Commencement address. Cheney served as a Republican representative of Wyoming from 2017-2023 and is now a professor of practice at the University of Virginia Center for Politics. WHERE: Ed Robson Arena, Colorado College campus, 849 N. Tejon St., Colorado Springs, 80903.
