Colorado College President L. Song Richardson Selected as Panelist at National Summit on Equal Opportunity in Higher Education

Richardson will lend her voice to Biden-Harris Administration's efforts to advance diversity following SCOTUS ruling on affirmative action

WHAT: On Wednesday, July 26, the U.S. Department of Education will host the National Summit on Equal Opportunity in Higher Education, a bringing together senior officials from the Biden-Harris Administration and leaders from national educational institutions, including Colorado College President L. Song Richardson, to discuss innovative strategies and resources for colleges and students to expand access to higher education in the wake of the recent Supreme Court ruling on affirmative action.

President Richardson will participate in the summit's third panel, "What Comes Next in College Admissions." A full list of the agenda can be found here.

WHY: The recent Supreme Court decision on college affirmative action programs has limited a vital tool that many institutions of higher education, including Colorado College, have used for decades to help create vibrant, diverse campus communities.
