**COLORADO SPRINGS, CO — June 30, 2026** — Curious minds of all ages are invited to join everyone's favorite mischievous monkey on an unforgettable musical adventure when *Curious George: The Golden Meatball* comes to the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at Colorado College. Music Theatre International will bring its production filled with catchy songs, heartwarming humor, and plenty of monkey-sized antics to the FAC's Music Room from Jul. 21-Aug. 2. The hour-long show runs at noon and 3 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays, and at 10 a.m. on weekdays.

The production's engaging storytelling and playful humor make it an ideal outing for families, school groups, and children experiencing theatre for the first time.

### **Land Acknowledgement**
