If you are interested in participating in research this summer, talk to your professors now and find out what research projects they are planning for the summer.

Start planning early — deadlines for summer research vary by department, and many professors have already begun to identify and select their summer research students. Faculty are eligible to apply for funding for a research student for a full 10 weeks of summer research for \$4,000. Some faculty may also have other funding sources.

Need-based campus housing scholarship applications will be available through the Office of the Provost after Spring Break.
