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Federal Tax withholding changes for Married Taxpayers due to 2018 Tax Table implementation

The IRS did not release the 2018 Withholding Tax Tables until the end of January. Per the IRS guidelines, your January paychecks were calculated based on the 2017 Tax Tables. **The February 15th paycheck is the first paycheck using the 2018 Tax Tables.**

Please note: The change will vary depending on your personal selection of pretax deductions and benefits such as medical, dental, and retirement contributions.
