

Can't Study Off-Campus For A Full Semester?

Colorado College approves 150+ full-semester off-campus study programs to meet a variety of academic needs. With proper planning, many students can make a full semester or even a year off-campus work academically. However, due to athletic schedules or other commitments, some students cannot be gone during certain blocks.

While CC Blocks taught off-campus during the school year and/or summer are a great option, here is a selection of information about other (perhaps less apparent) options from the CC semesters abroad listing. Be aware that program dates change from year-to-year, so you'll want to reconfirm the alignment of these programs with our block calendar to determine when you can be gone, but these are options which take up less than a full semester at CC.

CC Semesters with a Two-Block Option

Some of the CC Semesters give students an option to enroll for just two of the four blocks. Re-confirm with the faculty member(s) directing the program in any given year, as this may change based on demand and course structure.

- CC Semester in Lüneburg: Blocks 1 and 2 (*but preference given to full-semester students*)
- CC Semester in France: Blocks 5 and 6 (Tours) -or- 7 and 8 (Tours, Dakar)
- CC Semester in Latin America: Blocks 5 and 6 (Argentina) -or- 7 and 8 (Chile)
- CC Asia Semester: Blocks 7 and 8 (*varies by year, check with department*)
- CC in Russia: Blocks 7 and 8
- Our CC Exchange program with Quest University in British Columbia, Canada, gives preference to full-semester students (semester-long housing options at Quest are also typically much better), but it *may* be possible to do two blocks at Quest.

ACM Spring Trimester Programs

Please note: These programs are only offered Spring of 2019, and will be restructuring/discontinued after that term

Some of the ACM semester programs currently offer a shorter trimester option, instead of the full semester. When you select one of these programs, you still pay CC tuition for the entire semester (worth 4 blocks of credit). Therefore, since each of these ACM trimester options are worth 3 units at CC, you would be able to take **one** additional block that semester at CC to make up the full semester's worth of 4 units.

BLOCKS 5 & 6, 2019

ACM London Trimester: Arts in Context (early Jan to mid-March)

Students start with a three-week intensive "Museum Studies: Collecting The World in London" class, then take two classes concurrently for the last 7 weeks: London as a Visual Text, and the Theatre course taught by the visiting director

ACM Florence Trimester: Arts in Context (early Jan to mid-March)

Students start with a three-week intensive Italian language course, then take two classes concurrently for the last 7 weeks, chosen from a range of electives (generally related to Art, Art History, or Italian History & Culture)

ACM India: Social Entrepreneurship and Development (early January to mid-March)

All students complete a credit-bearing internship in development, as well as choosing two elective courses from three choices: Development Economics, Contemporary India, or Hindi Language

BLOCKS 7 & 8, 2019

ACM Costa Rica: Field Research in the Environment, Social Sciences, and Humanities. (early April to mid-June)

Students earn the equivalent of 3 CC units, spread over the following courses: Spanish Language and Culture, Field Research Design, Field Research, Research Paper & Seminar Course

ACM Chicago Program: Arts, Entrepreneurship, and Justice (mid-March to late May)

All students complete a credit bearing internship, as well as choosing two elective courses from three choices: Museums and Cultural Equity, Entrepreneurship & Innovation in Chicago, or Human Rights, Social Justice, and Race in the Chicago Context

Full Academic Semester Programs with Condensed or Non-Traditional Calendars

These programs each yield a full semester's worth of credit (4 units) in a shorter amount of time or differently-aligned schedule with our academic calendar. If you do one of these programs, you will not be eligible to enroll in any other additional blocks back at CC in that same semester (without paying a course overload fee, per class, of 1/3 CC's semester tuition), *even if* the calendar dates align. You *may* be able to get special permission from the Dean of Student Life (and Housing, if necessary) to be physically back on campus before or after your program but not taking classes for those blocks if, for example, you are required to be on campus for a sport. In the past, these programs have matched CC's academic calendar; however, check each program's website for specific dates.

Blocks 1, 2, and 3:

CIEE South Africa: Arts and Sciences, Cape Town – direct enroll at University of Cape Town (*mid-July through mid-November*)

Frontiers Abroad: The Geology of New Zealand or New Zealand Earth Systems (*early June to mid-November*)

HECUA Norway: Globalization, National Identity, and the Politics of Belonging (*mid-August to late November*)

IFSA Australia: University of Melbourne

IFSA Australia: James Cook University

IFSA Australia: University of Sydney

IFSA New Zealand: University of Auckland

IFSA New Zealand: University of Otago, Dunedin

(the Australia/New Zealand academic calendar for Fall generally runs late June/early-July to mid-November)

SEA Semester: Sustainability in Polynesian Island Cultures and Ecosystems (Polynesia to New Zealand) (*late Aug – mid Nov*)

Blocks 2, 3, and 4:

IFSA Butler England: Oxford University
*(The standard Oxford fall calendar doesn't generally begin until the end of September, and runs to early December. This program only yields 3 CC units, so you **COULD** take Block 1 at CC, if dates align, for the CC semester tuition paid.)*

SEA Semester: Climate & Society (to New Zealand) (*late Sept – mid Dec*)

SEA Semester: Caribbean Reef Expedition (Grenada to St. Croix) (*early Oct - late Dec*)

Blocks 5 and 6:

SEA Semester: Colonization to Conservation in the Caribbean (St. Croix to Key West) (*early Jan – mid March*)

SEA Semester: The Global Ocean (to New Zealand) (*early Jan – mid March*)

Blocks 5, 6, and 7:

South India Term Abroad (*early Jan to mid-April*)

Blocks 6, 7, and 8:

CET China: Beijing Intensive Chinese Language Semester -or- Shanghai Internship Semester

CIEE Seoul, South Korea: Arts and Sciences

IFSA Argentina: Argentine Universities Program, Buenos Aires

IFSA Argentina: Psychology in English -OR- Business and Economics in English

IFSA Argentina: Argentina, Mendoza Universities Program

IFSA Australia: University of Sydney

IFSA Chile: Chilean Universities Program, Santiago

IFSA Chile: Chilean Universities Program, Valparaiso

IFSA New Zealand: University of Otago, Dunedin

(the Australia/New Zealand and Argentina/Chile academic calendar for Spring generally runs mid-Feb through late June)

SEA Semester: Marine Biodiversity and Conservation (Key West to New York City) (*late Feb – late May*)

SIT Argentina: Public Health in Urban Environments

SIT Argentina: Social Movements and Human Rights

SIT Chile: Comparative Education and Social Change
