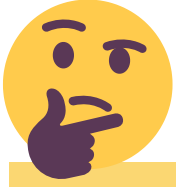
TIMING

This pulls from Summit, and is searchable by major, minor, specific program, or "Registrar Type" -- which All-College Requirements they're approved to fulfill.
