MU222/PA222: The Arts and Culture of Bali (Taught in Bali, Indonesia) Colorado College Summer Session 2020 Special Schedule: June 12-July 4) (Students should arrive in Bali, Indonesia on June 12, 2020)

INSTRUCTORS

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COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course explores the arts and culture of Bali, Indonesia, on location in Bali. Music, dance, theater, and visual arts are ubiquitous in Bali, where artistic production is far out of proportion to the size and population of the island. The Hindu-Balinese religion (*Agama Hindu Dharma*) requires performing and visual arts for the successful completion of the thousands of ceremonies undertaken each year, and therefore virtually every Balinese person is a dancer, musician, actor, visual artist, or poet, and many individuals are equally competent in several media. The unique history and culture of Bali are best understood through the arts, which connect past to present, self to community, and religion to reality. Students and faculty will live in the Lasmawan family compound while in Bangah. The compound has been outfitted with a *gamelan angklung, gamelan gong kebyar, gamelan gender wayang, gamelan baleganjur*, and *gamelan joged bumbung* for course use.

The daily class schedule in Bali will include lectures and discussion of readings on Balinese history, culture, arts, and the environment followed by practical instruction in traditional music, dance, painting, and wood-carving. Students will experience Balinese arts and culture through participation in daily life, attendance at a wide range of performances, and lecture-demonstrations by a variety of artists and craftsmen.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Provide students with an in-depth understanding of the music and performance styles of Bali
- Critically analyze the impact of colonization, globalization, and tourism on the arts and environment in Bali
- Refine and advance students' research and writing skills
- Learn to perform instrumental and vocal music and dance from Bali

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Students will share responsibility for directing discussion of readings. In addition to the collective work of lecture/seminar sessions, students will receive practical instruction in traditional music and dance on a daily basis. Each student will undertake an individual presentation in Bali (prepared in advance) on an aspect of Balinese art, culture, or performance. Students will present their work during class meetings in Bali, both individually and in pairs. Each student will also complete a written experience and reading journal to be submitted at the end of the course (some prompts will be provided in Bali).

WRITING ASSIGNMENTS

In addition to required readings, participation in class discussions and music and dance instruction, and individual and paired presentations, students will be expected to prepare an ongoing readings and reaction journal which will be collected at the conclusion of the course. Students will be asked to submit this on June 21 – journals will be returned before departure.
