What are your main responsibilities as a PIFP fellow?

The Department is going through a transition right now that involves implementing new contracts. I'm looking at proposals submitted (by external organizations) to get those contracts and trying to put together a list of recommendations to inform a "Learning Collaborative" in which the contractors will meet and hopefully try to improve Medicaid delivery.
