- 1. Boots on the Ground Stewardship VOC recognizes that hands-on experience is the most powerful means of creating a caring public and VOC's volunteer projects will continue to be designed to do just that. Primacy will be given to the furtherance of VOC's public volunteer projects that foster both first- time and long-term volunteers.
- 2. Stewardship Innovation Tactics Focus on strengthening the capacity within partnering outdoor stewardship organizations (OSOs) and within land management agencies to actively carry out stewardship efforts.
- **3. OSO Coalition Building -** Change the conversation in the state to embrace stewardship as both a principle and a practice with a broader, more tactical, macro-level focus on funding and advocating for statewide stewardship.

Youth and Families Coordinator

Primary responsibilities of PIFP fellow (bulleted list; 100 words or less):

The Youth and Families Coordinator will be responsible for coordinating and running our Middle School Play, Learn, Serve program, GOCO Inspire Program, Youth SWATs and other youth and family programs, as well as nurturing/strengthening existing partnerships. A primary focus area relates to recruiting for and running the youth projects that take place in largely Hispanic neighborhoods.

Specific Responsibilities include:

- Program development 10%
- Managing logistical requirements of projects 70%
 - Coordinating youth volunteer opportunities and project team members through a project planning process

- Facilitating communications with youth participants, parents, land managers, and other partner organizations

- Documenting results and tracking outcomes and impacts.
- Making necessary adjustments to meet program goals.
- Assist with the recruitment of volunteers, including effective target marketing, project segmentation, in-kind solicitation and developing volunteer communication strategies.- 10%
- Collaborating on community and state-wide youth-related outdoor initiatives 5%
- Working with entire VOC staff on organizational strategic initiatives 5%
