Health Policy Fellow: A representative of CCHI who supports our policy manager by doing research and attending legislative hearings, writing issue briefs and blogs, creating infographics, supporting event logistics, developing policy arguments, tracking legislation, and hosting stakeholder meetings

A typical week as a PIFP fellow in our office will look something like this:

Health Policy Fellow:

A typical week for the Health Policy Fellow will be working on a research project, attending stakeholder meetings with partner organizations, legislators and or regulators. The fellow will attend conferences and trainings. He or She will be responsible for planning meeting agendas, preparing meeting materials and taking notes. The fellow will be assisting the policy manager and working with our membership organizations and coalitions regarding framing health issues and solutions, prepping consumers for media and testimony, and creating fact sheets and blogs to support health policy work.

What support or professional development can the fellow expect from their supervisor, the team/staff, or the organization?

This work can be intense and our staff promotes self care and mutual support. We do weekly check-ins with supervisors and the team, but also have a no wrong door policy where every employee is able to ask questions of any employee. CCHI is committed to being a learning community to grow and do our best work for the community. We will also be hosting two fellows, so there will be collaborative training & work opportunities. CCHI offers a free RTD ECO Pass, valued at \$540/year, and a cell phone stipend at \$600/year. CCHI also pays 100% Health Dental, Vision, Accident, Death and Dismemberment, Long and Short term Disability Insurance and generous Paid Time Off.

Health Policy Fellow:

• Research and analyze health policy issues; summarize findings in written reports, memos, and policy issue briefs

- Write for monthly e-newsletter and draft blogs on timely health care topics
- Assist in developing arguments for or against proposed policies related to legislative and regulatory policy priorities

• Advocate for policy priorities, including the passage of legislation and regulatory changes

- Track legislation related to organization legislative priorities
- Attend legislative hearings
- Serve as a representative from CCHI at member and stakeholder meetings
- Prepare agendas, write meeting minutes, and disseminate materials for meetings
- Inform CCHI members of health policy issues and legislative updates
- Update website with organizational positions on health care policy issues
- Create infographics and fact sheets for policy content
- Support event logistics, such as organizing advocacy efforts at the Capitol

Through this fellowship, you will build capacity in our organization by:

The Policy Fellow will research and analyze health policy issues, summarize findings, write blogs, assist in developing arguments and advocate for or against proposed policies related to legislative and regulatory policy priorities, serve as a representative of CCHI at stakeholder meetings and assist the policy manager.

The ways in which you will contribute to societal systemic change during this fellowship:

For the policy fellow: CCHI strives to advance community-driven policies to achieve health equity for Coloradans. By supporting our policy work through story collection, policy analysis, coalition building and more, our fellow will get first-hand experience making a difference for Colorado at the State Capitol, Division of Insurance, and other departments by fighting for more transparency, affordability, and equity in health care and preventing financial insecurity. The "CAP" Fellow will directly assist consumers with medical bills and affording prescription drugs by providing guidance with appeals, complaints, and hospital assistance applications. He or she will collect client data, maintain partner relationships, develop assistance tools, research issues, and market the program.

Policy fellow will hone expertise in intersectional health policy issues, researching complex topics and communicating barriers by raising the consumer voice to create positive changes. This fellow will expand their professional network by working with key stakeholders, members and consumers, and learn more about how to frame arguments and how legislative and regulatory changes are made.

Advice and Application Follow-up

Our advice for those who apply:

Health Policy Fellow:

CCHI has a small, passionate staff continually striving for health equity, access and affordability. It may take time to get up to speed with health policy, issues, acronyms and meet the key stakeholders. CCHI offers a lot of opportunity to work on several policy issues including interacting with strategic engagement, our direct service program and field work, and learning how the teams work together. The fellowship is a combination of working independently and on teams. The Colorado Legislative Session (Jan - May) can be a busy time. This position requires excellent research, writing, communication and time management skills.

Additional information applicants should know about the organization and/or this position:

Policy Fellow: We are a small organization so many of our staff wear "multiple hats", which is an opportunity for a variety of tasks making the position interesting. The content matter we work with can be very niche and wonky, so this position will be best for someone open to learning how you can advance health equity and social justice through technical policy and regulatory change. We have a diverse staff and are committed to being an anti-racist organization with ongoing efforts to center equity in our work while providing DEI training and learning opportunities.
