A typical week as a PIFP fellow in our office will look something like this:

40% Silent Auction Management

- Organizing silent auction packages
- Soliciting new and past silent auction sponsors
- Maintaining a system to organize and track all incoming silent auction donations 30% Event Planning and Assistance
- Participating in planning, outreach, and logistics for One Colorado's summer fundraising events
- 20% Donor Stewardship

- Responsible for donor acknowledgment in a timely manner 10% Professional Development
- Meeting with other department heads to identify areas of interest outside of development
- Coordinating with supervisor to arrange opportunities to gain experience in areas of interest

What support or professional development can the fellow expect from their supervisor, the team/staff, or the organization?

The fellow will have a dedicated supervisor with at least one one-hour check-in every week to discuss progress, lessons learned, and any questions that may arise during the week. The fellow's first week will be solely dedicated to orientation and onboarding. This includes reviewing the position expectations, setting up meetings will every team member, reading important organization publications, and discussing opportunities for growth.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Identify and solicit silent and live auction donations
- Maintain relationships with auction donors and manage gift acknowledgment process
- Assist Development Team with day-to-day operations
- Upload silent auction items into public-facing auction platform
- Work with communications staff to implement online fundraising campaigns as needed
- Support and track direct mail solicitations
- Identify and develop marketing opportunities to promote and brand the organization
