### **MARK FIORE '91**

WINNER OF THE 2010 Pulitzer Prize for political cartooning, Mark Fiore is widely regarded as one of the best online journalists at work in the United States. His Pulitzer citation reads: "Awarded to Mark Fiore, self-syndicated, for his animated cartoons appearing on SFGate.com, the *San Francisco Chronicle* website, where his biting wit, extensive research and ability to distill complex issues set a high standard for an emerging form of commentary." The Pulitzer award was the first ever given for entirely online journalistic animations. *The Wall Street Journal* called him "The undisputed guru of the form." The American Library Association Booklist noted the "unique and personal vision" of his cartoons. His work can be found at Slate.com, CBS News.com, the NPR website, and his own site, Mark Fiore.com.

Fiore's earlier awards include the Robert F. Kennedy Journalism Award in 2004, two awards from the Online News Association in 2002 and 2008, and 2001 and 2002 awards for his work in new media from the National Cartoonists Society. In 2006 he received The James Madison Freedom of Information Award from The Society of Professional Journalists.

Mark Fiore grew up in California and spent much of his free time in remote areas of Idaho. His interest in art appeared in middle school and continued to grow. "I was the kid that was always drawing," he said. As a political science major at Colorado College, he merged his artistic talents with his studies of a broad array of subjects in the liberal arts, but politics had a special fascination for him.

Graduating from Colorado College in 1991, he worked for a time as a political cartoonist at the *San Jose Mercury News*. Just over a decade ago, as the Internet grew in popularity and influence, he saw the untapped potential of animated cartooning. With the encouragement of the *San Francisco Chronicle*, he began to publish cartoons on the *Chronicle* website and elsewhere, rising to national and international prominence as a brilliant pioneer in the field.

As a self-styled liberal, Mark Fiore's acerbic cartoons are particularly tough on current targets such as the Tea Party, Goldman Sachs, and pedophilia in the Catholic Church, but he can be equally hard — and at the same time hilariously funny — on Barack Obama and the current administration.

### ANNE CARSON

ACLASSICIST OF THE first rank, a spectacular translator (from Greek, Latin, and German), a brilliant poet, and a remarkable philosopher/critic, Anne Carson is quite simply one of the great writers at work in the world today.

Born in Toronto, Carson fell in love with the Greek and Latin languages early in her life, eventually pursuing degrees in classics from the University of Toronto. It is the very logic of love that Carson articulates with passionate care in her book-length essay, "Eros the Bittersweet" (1986): Beginning with the fragmentary literary remains of the archaic Greek poet Sappho, she weaves a work of scholarship and a theory of love infused with poetic imagination.

Carson revels in breaking distinctions of genre, mixing verse and essay, etymology and poetry, narrative and dramatic modes. She has, for example, published two novels in verse: "Autobiography of Red" (1998) and "The Beauty of the Husband: A Fictional Essay in 29 Tangos" (2001). "Autobiography of Red" takes its cue from yet another ancient Greek poet, Stesichorus, provocatively positioning him simply between Homer and Gertrude Stein, with Carson noting that this history is "a difficult interval for a poet." This whimsical opening reveals the deep truth of Carson's art: Collapsing the whole history of poetry from the ancients to the avant-garde, she manages effortlessly to be both ancient and avant-garde herself. She honors the ancients, while insisting that our sense of them is desperately fragmentary, and she honors the modernists of the 20th century, who grounded their own sense of the fragmentary character of modernity in the legacies of ancient cultures.

In the last decade, Carson has devoted herself largely to translation work. Her collection of the fragments of Sappho, "If Not, Winter" (2002), celebrates the conjectural quality of everything we think we "know" about the archaic poet, while her versions of Euripides, collected in "Grief Lessons" (2006), bring to life the various ways in which "the actor, by reiterating you, sacrifices a moment of his own life in order to give you a story of yours." Carson's most recent book, "Nox" (2010), unfolds from within a box as an accordion-folded scroll. A collage of fragments — words and images from scrapbooks, journals, and letters; Latin dictionary entries with illustrative quotations — the work spills from its pages as an act of mourning and homage to the poet's dead brother, a matter not of literary artifice but of existential experience, even as it offers itself as a kind of commentary on an epitaph by Catullus.

Exploring Paul Celan's understanding of "what a poet knows" in her visionary fusion of philosophy and poetry, "Economy of the Unlost" (1999), Carson suggests that "poetry is an act of memory that carves its way between sand art and snow art, transforming what is innumerable and headed for oblivion into a timeless notation. Excising all that is not grace." It is through her preservation of such grace that Anne Carson herself has emerged as a great poet and thinker.

### RICHARD F. CELESTE

DICK CELESTE began his term as 12th president of Colorado College in July 2002. During his presidency, the number of tenure-track faculty increased from 150 to 170; resources for faculty, student, and faculty-student collaborative research significantly increased; the applicant pool rose from 3,400 to 4,900, with a parallel rise in academic talent and diversity; and both retention and the graduation rate improved. In addition, the LEED-certified Edith Kinney Gaylord Cornerstone Arts Center was built, numerous existing buildings and the IT infrastructure upgraded, and a new Long-Range Development Plan created.

Prior to joining CC, Celeste served as the United States ambassador to India under President Bill Clinton from 1997–2001. From 1982–1990 he served as governor of Ohio, where he expanded health care, education, and welfare. He served as director of the United States Peace Corps (1979–1981) under President Jimmy Carter and was responsible for 53 countries. Previously, he served one term as lieutenant governor of Ohio (1974–1978) and two terms as an Ohio state representative (1970–1974). He was special assistant to Chester Bowles, then ambassador to India, from 1963–1967. Could he have known that his public service career would bring him full circle to the embassy 34 years later?

Equally at ease in the private sector, Dick Celeste was a managing partner of Celeste and Sabety Ltd., an economic development consultancy. Active in academia before arriving at CC, he was a Rhodes scholar and *magna cum laude* Yale graduate who served as a visiting fellow in public policy at Case Western University. He currently is chair of the board of trustees of the Health Effects Institute in Boston, a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, chair of the Associated Colleges of the Midwest Board of Directors, a member of the American Academy of Diplomacy, and a lifetime national associate of the National Academies. He is an advisory board member of the Institute of International Education and serves on the boards of Glimcher Realty Trust and the Garden City Company.

Reflecting recently on his rich and varied career, Celeste identified chance as the most important ingredient. "I am a great believer in serendipity," he said. "Many times in life a door will open, and the question is, 'Are you ready to go through it?'" Opportunity surely matters, but others would say that his energy, vision, resilience, and broadening experience propelled him from one success to the next.
