#### What are we looking for?

  - ► Urban, rural, agricultural, industrial, trade
- Education, employment, environment, public health, transportation, water use
- ► Racial, ethnic, and language minority groups
- Not relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates

2020 Census - Public Law 94-171

- Indian reservations maps & data included
- School districts maps & data included
- Data on race and national origin
- ► Make your own maps by block, precinct, city, county
- Shaded areas or pie charts showing percent of population

American Community Survey

- Schedule
- ► Questions to 300,000 households each month
- ► Answers compiled & released each year
- Topics
- ▶ Education
- ► Housing
- ► Employment
- ► Transportation
- Communication

## How might we find them?

State & Local Governments

- State maps of economic development regions
- Local government maps of neighborhoods or planning districts

### How might we find them?

Public hearings

- Before a plan is drawn
  - Testimony and documents on what communities exist in the area
- Testimony and documents on which cities and counties should be included in a district to preserve those communities of interest
- On a proposed plan
  - Whether the proposed plan preserves communities of interest better than alternative plans
