“Cory B. Scott ‘13, Mathematics and Computer Science Faculty, notes several concerns with these models, including biases and that ChatGPT and related models are good at producing human-sounding language, but there is nothing that ensures their output is factual. ‘This means they can produce very authoritative-sounding text that contains completely made-up facts,’ he says, adding that companies creating and training these models are not transparent about where the data comes from, which means data with race and gender biases produces AIs with the same biases.”
