## Space change requests – next steps

- The book return bins in both the Garden Level and 3<sup>rd</sup> floor Art Collection will move forward after placement of bins has been decided.
- The Advising Hub's request to change their area by rearranging furniture, remove the front portion of the desk in the reception area as well as the cabinets on the south wall and purchase a literature rack. These improvement will be paid for from the Dean's Office. Cascaded computers (2) that will be removed from open areas (floors 2 & 3) can be set up along the back counter. There was support for this proposal. An idea was floated about whether the pocket doors that lead into room 231 might also be permanently closed in order to provide additional wall space usage for the Hub.
