Chris Lieber, N.E.S. Inc. explained the consultant team's role in the project is to capture the vision of Colorado College and



the City of Colorado Springs, and to communicate and implement the best possible plan that works for the college, the city and the adjacent neighborhoods. He described the exercise scenario and gave attendees instructions for the workshop tasks, encouraging attendees to work together in the small groups to form their recommendations, taking into account all variables noted in the workshop handouts.



Public Engagement Process

To assist in the planning and design process for the Robson Arena, the college has engaged a multidisciplinary team of architects, planners, civil and traffic engineers, public engagement facilitators, and landscape architects.

The public process will assure the team receives input and feedback from the community on topics such as traffic, parking, the fan experience, building specifics, season ticket program, and other important aspects of the arena's implementation. A series of community meetings and workshops will take place on Saturdays to enable maximum participation.
