

HONOR COUNCIL INVESTIGATION TIMELINE



Co-Chair Meeting

The Supervising Co-Chair meets with the reporting party to review evidence and confirm the eligibility for an Honor Council Investigation.

(If the professor is not the reporting party, following this first meeting, a professor meeting occurs.)



Initial Report

Report of potential Honor Code violation sent to Honor Council Co-Chairs at HonorCouncil@coloradocollege.edu.



Investigator Meeting

Two Honor Council investigators (per accused student) are assigned to the case. The investigators will meet with the reporting party and gather testimony.

Confidential Investigation

Investigators will meet with the accused student at least once and determine if it is more likely than not that an Honor Code violation occurred and if the suspected violation is flagrant. If this evidentiary standard is met, the student will receive a letter of accusation outlining the suspected violation and they will *admit to the violation* or *assert that no violation occurred*.



Admission of Violation

The student admits to violating the Code. The investigators send a sanction recommendation to the professor.



Assertion of No Violation

The student asserts they did not violate the Honor Code.



Panel of Peers

A panel of seven Honor Council members will hear from all involved parties. If they confirm the violation, the professor receives a sanction recommendation.
