Reunion Giving Designations & Details

This is optional for your reunion!

You do not have to select a class gift project or fundraise unless you as a committee choose to do so.

You have options:

- Do nothing in regards to fundraising
- Select a designation but not send/silicate your class in any way, only mention of its existence within other reunion communications in case someone would like to contribute on behalf of the reunion.
- If you as a committee decide to select a Class Gift Project designation, please select one below that your class would want to help support and can get behind.

1. Current Use Named Scholarship

An annual fund scholarship named for your reunion. Any/all funds the reunion class can raise within the calendar year will be distributed in the next academic year.

2. Your Already Established Endowed Scholarships

Classes or donors have already established an endowed scholarship fund. A reunion class can choose to designate one of these funds as their Class Gift Project. Any funds raised during the calendar year would be added to that fund.
